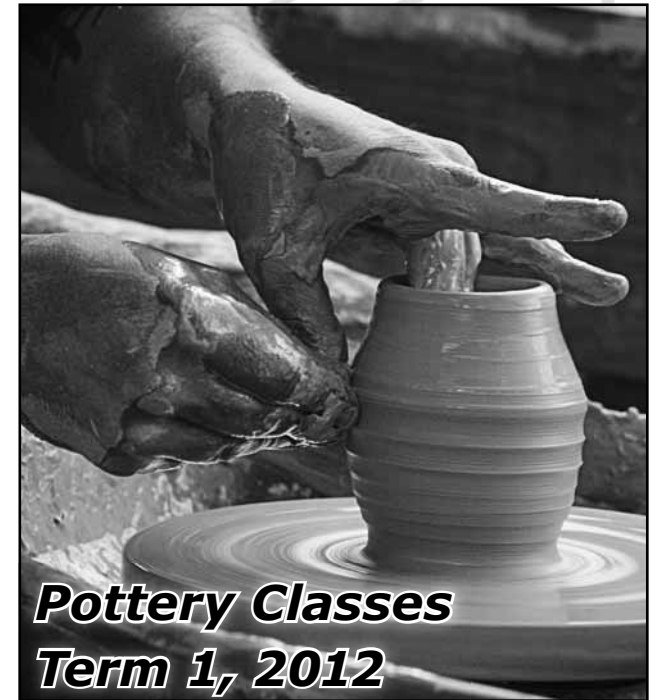
Weekend Workshops
