#### **Description of Entity's Outcomes**

The mission is to promote and encourage education and involvement in pottery and the ceramic arts. Thus the outcomes can be divided into a few different categories like members, outreach units, educational units and Otago polytechnic students. The learning at local level is in the form of classes but the society also provides premises and tutors for Otago poly-tech for tertiary diploma in ceramic arts.

#### Description and Quantification of the Entity's Outputs

Stated below are further descriptions to entity's outcomes:-

- WSP financial members paid memberships each year.
- Otago Polytechnic Students Otago polytechnic satellite students doing a full year course of study.
- Educational Units a single lesson provided to a single individual.
- Besides the above four there are also exhibitions which means a successful open day, contributions to local exhibitions, demonstrations. Our own regional exhibition, rotational involvement in national exhibit as well as high participation in clay art skills by the general community.

#### **Additional Output Measures**

Outreach sessions in Huntly have resulted in the Huntly Friendship House starting their own regular clay club.

Working with ten Hamilton/Waikato schools, firing hundreds of pieces for multiple classes.

One member with specific special needs has, with support, gone from being terrified to be in a room with strangers to enjoying a particular making technique to the point of making bowls so well that they are now sold through Arts Post Gallery, thus enabling her to earn some of her own money for the first time in her life.

An Artist in Residence was accepted into the Portage Ceramic Awards.

One member who was an Artist in Residence during the year was accepted into the Portage Ceramic Awards and also won the People's Choice Award at our annual members exhibition.

Another Artist in Residence was accepted into the WaiClay Art Award and also won the Premier Award at our annual members exhibition.

Diploma Students won the Presidents Award, Hamilton Pottery Tools Award and the WaiClay Award at our annual members exhibition.

Providing special classes and school holiday sessions for homeschooled children.

Working with Hamilton Kindergarten four sessions per year.



Working with local Scouts Groups four sessions per year.
Working with the YWCA & YMCA four sessions per year.
Working with Occupational Therapy groups.
Working with Pathways - bridging the gap for people with mental health needs.
Working with the IHC to provide a workshop for their clients and their buddies.
Working with at risk youth via Oranga Tamariki.
Working with Te Kura Kaupapa - to provide art experience in Maori & bilingual schools.
Working with High Performance NZ to provide Art therapy for High Performance athletes.
Working with the Prime Ministers Scholarship recipient to provide arts rehabilitation.
Working with Hamilton Bonsai Club (Not for Profit Organisation) to provide art therapy.

Facilitated several corporate team building and social events for various organisations.

Facilitated Mum's Day Out event for the Child Cancer Foundation.

#### **Additional Information**

- Waikato Society of Potters premises and equipment is also used by other community & educational groups from kindergarten to clubs. The significant contribution to Hamilton Community is recognised by Hamilton City Council by providing premise lease at community arts rates.
- Community Outreach such as 'Play with Clay' is attended by a high number of welfare dependent/ disabled, immigrant involvements and home school families of all ages by about 15 different nationalities including Maori, Pasifika, Russian, Chinese, Indian, Korean, Spanish and a variety of Europeans.

#### **Basis of Preparation**

The entity has elected to apply PBE SFR-A (NFP) Public Benefit Entity Simple Format Reporting - Accrual (Not-For-Profit) on the basis that it does not have public accountability and has total annual expenses equal to or less than \$2,000,000. All transactions in the Performance Report are reported using the accrual basis of accounting. The Performance Report is prepared under the assumption that the entity will continue to operate in the foreseeable future.

#### Goods and Services Tax (GST)

The entity is registered for GST. All amounts are stated exclusive of goods and services tax (GST) except for accounts payable and accounts receivable which are stated inclusive of GST.

#### Income Tax

Waikato Society of Potters is wholly exempt from New Zealand income tax having fully complied with all statutory conditions for these exemptions.

#### **Bank Accounts and Cash**

Bank accounts and cash in the Statement of Cash Flows comprise cash balances and bank balances (including short term deposits) with original maturities of 90 days or less.

#### **Changes in Accounting Policies**

There have been no changes in accounting policies. Policies have been applied on a consistent basis with those of the previous reporting period.
