Description of Entity's Outcomes

The mission is to promote and encourage education and involvement in pottery and the ceramic arts. Thus the outcomes can be divided into a few different categories like members, outreach units, educational units and Otago polytechnic students. The learning at local level is in the form of classes but the society also provides premises and tutors for Otago poly-tech for tertiary diploma in ceramic arts.

Description and Quantification of the Entity's Outputs

Stated below are further descriptions to entity's outcomes:-

- WSP financial members paid memberships each year.
- Otago Polytechnic Students Otago Polytechnic Satellite Students working towards a tertiary qualification in ceramics
- Educational Units a single lesson provided to a single individual.
- Besides the above Community Outreach Units we also contribute to local exhibitions and demonstrations including holding an online virtual exhibition on FaceBook during lockdown. We hold our own regional exhibition, rotational involvement in national exhibitions as well as high levels of participation in clay/ceramic art skills by the general community

Due to the effects of Covid our traditional Community Outreach programmes have been reduced this year. We have not been able to facilitate or have had reduced interest from Community Groups in sharing our space. However we have had a significantly greater interest from the community in general in our classes, workshops and Play with Clay sessions.

We have responded by offering more classes in mini-terms to cater for this burgeoning interest in the exploration of clay arts. We have also initiated a professional development programme to foster more potters/ceramic artists into teaching roles and making a career through their work.

We were unable to hold our traditional Open Day due to the Covid Lockdown however we instead held a very successful 3 day Clay Festival over Waitangi weekend attended by 43 potters from all over the North Island.

We have opened a second stream for students to attend the practical Diploma training modules. This is a more affordable option to suit people interested in gaining technical skill but not interested in achieving a formal qualification.

Additional Output Measures

- Working with Hamilton/Waikato Schools, firing hundreds of pieces for multiple classes
- Providing special classes and school holiday sessions for homeschool children
- Working with at risk youth via Oranga Tamariki
- Working with Te Aho o Te Kura Pounamu
- Working with Te Kura Kaupapa providing art experience in Maori & bilingual schools
- Facilitated corporate team building and social events for various organisations



Additional Information

- Waikato Society of Potters premises and equipment is also used by other community & educational groups from kindergarten to clubs. The significant contribution to Hamilton Community is recognised by Hamilton City Council by providing premise lease at community arts rates.
- Community Outreach such as 'Play with Clay' is attended by a high number of welfare dependent/ disabled, immigrant involvements and home school families of all ages by about 15 different nationalities including Maori, Pasifika, Russian, Chinese, Indian, Korean, Spanish and a variety of Europeans.

Basis of Preparation

The entity has elected to apply PBE SFR-A (NFP) Public Benefit Entity Simple Format Reporting - Accrual (Not-For-Profit) on the basis that it does not have public accountability and has total annual expenses equal to or less than \$2,000,000. All transactions in the Performance Report are reported using the accrual basis of accounting. The Performance Report is prepared under the assumption that the entity will continue to operate in the foreseeable future.

Goods and Services Tax (GST)

The entity is registered for GST. All amounts are stated exclusive of goods and services tax (GST) except for accounts payable and accounts receivable which are stated inclusive of GST.

Income Tax

Waikato Society of Potters is wholly exempt from New Zealand income tax having fully complied with all statutory conditions for these exemptions.

Bank Accounts and Cash

Bank accounts and cash in the Statement of Cash Flows comprise cash balances and bank balances (including short term deposits) with original maturities of 90 days or less.

Changes in Accounting Policies

There have been no changes in accounting policies. Policies have been applied on a consistent basis with those of the previous reporting period.
